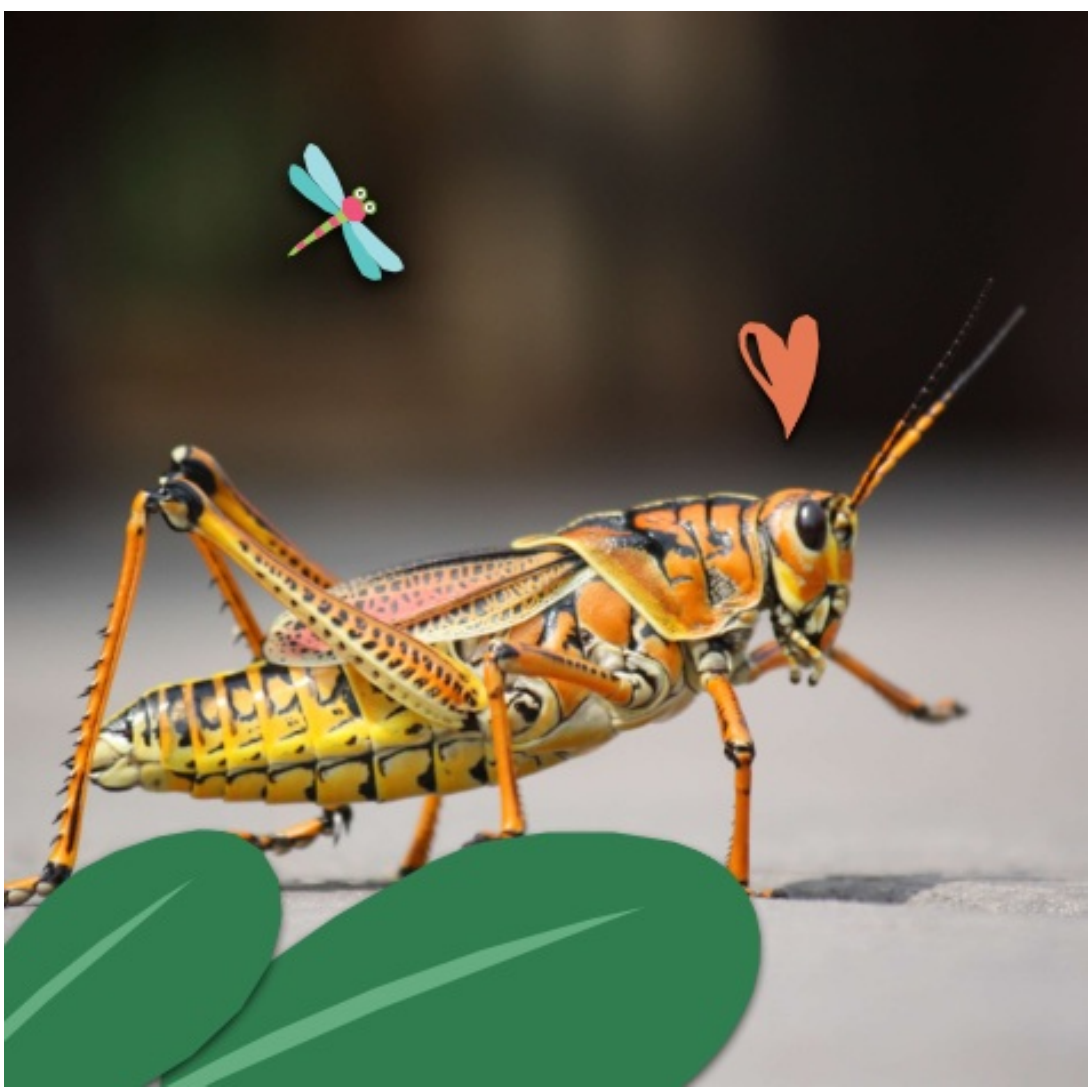

up high.



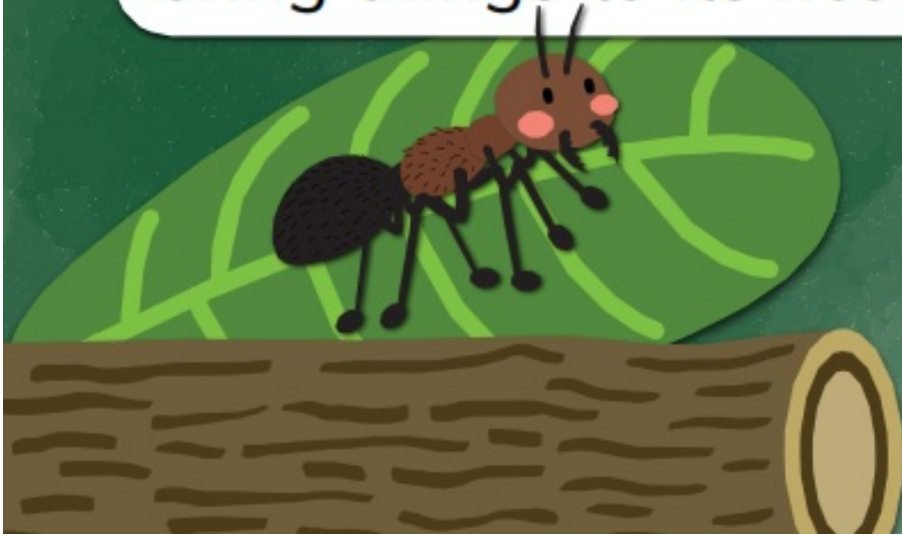


This is an insect. It is a ladybug. Its six little legs are under its shell.

has a lot of legs.



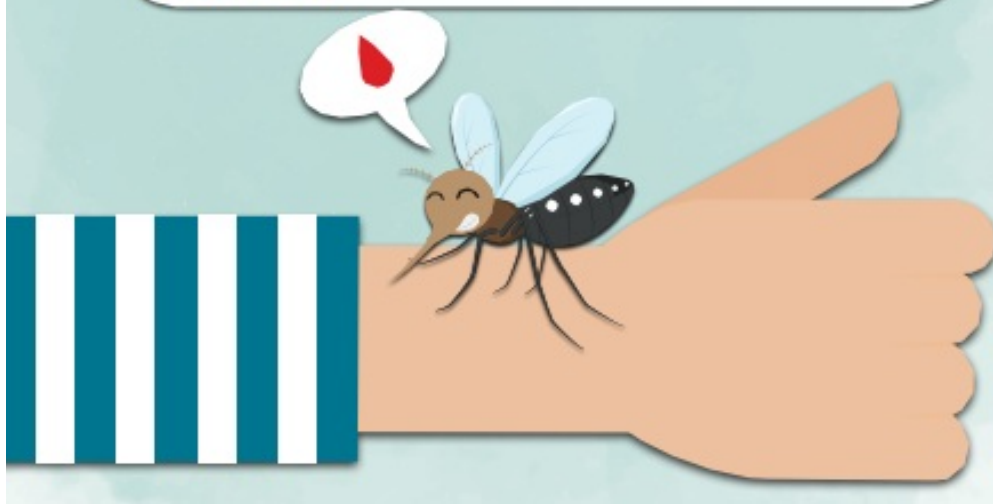


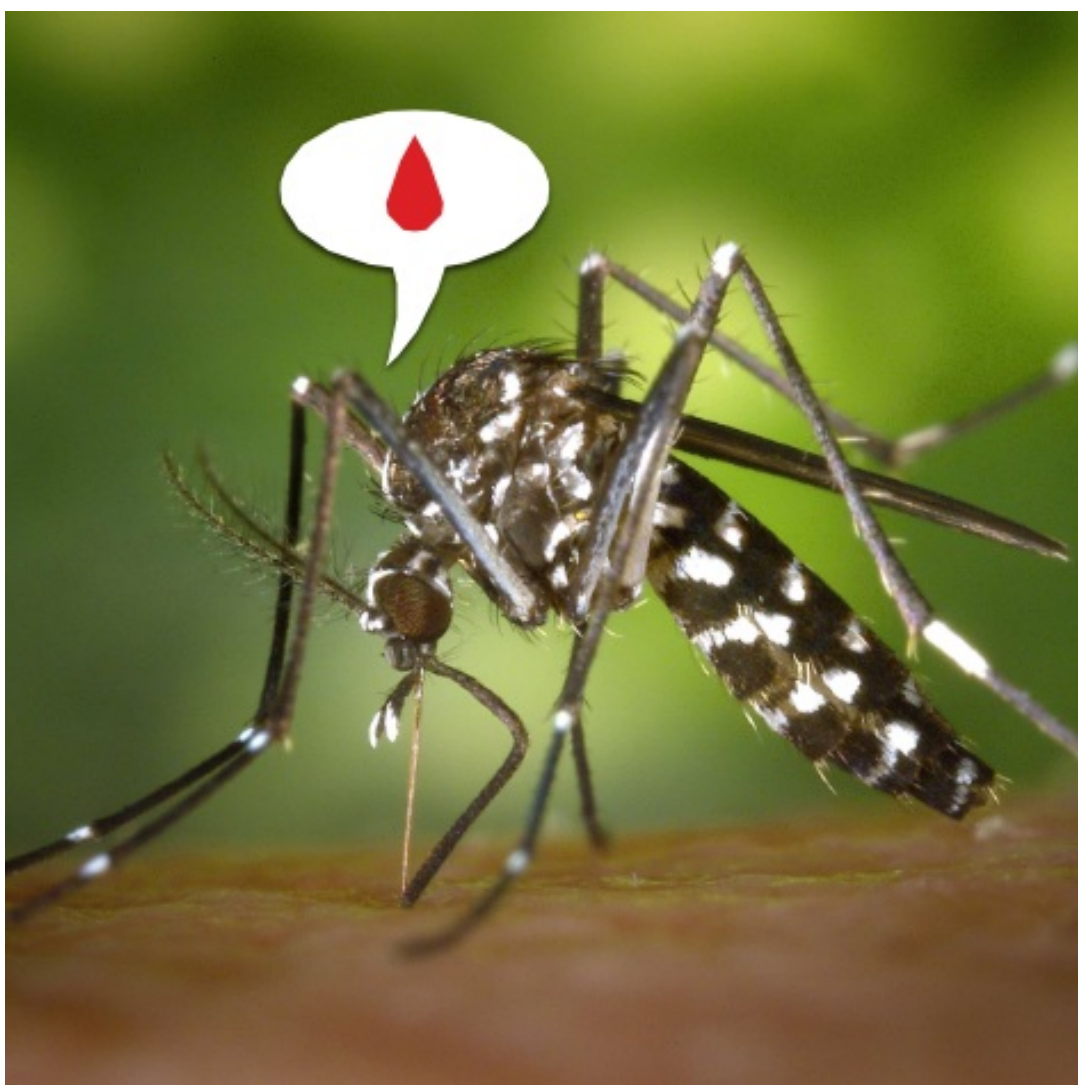
This is an insect. It is a wasp. Its six legs are resting on a flower.





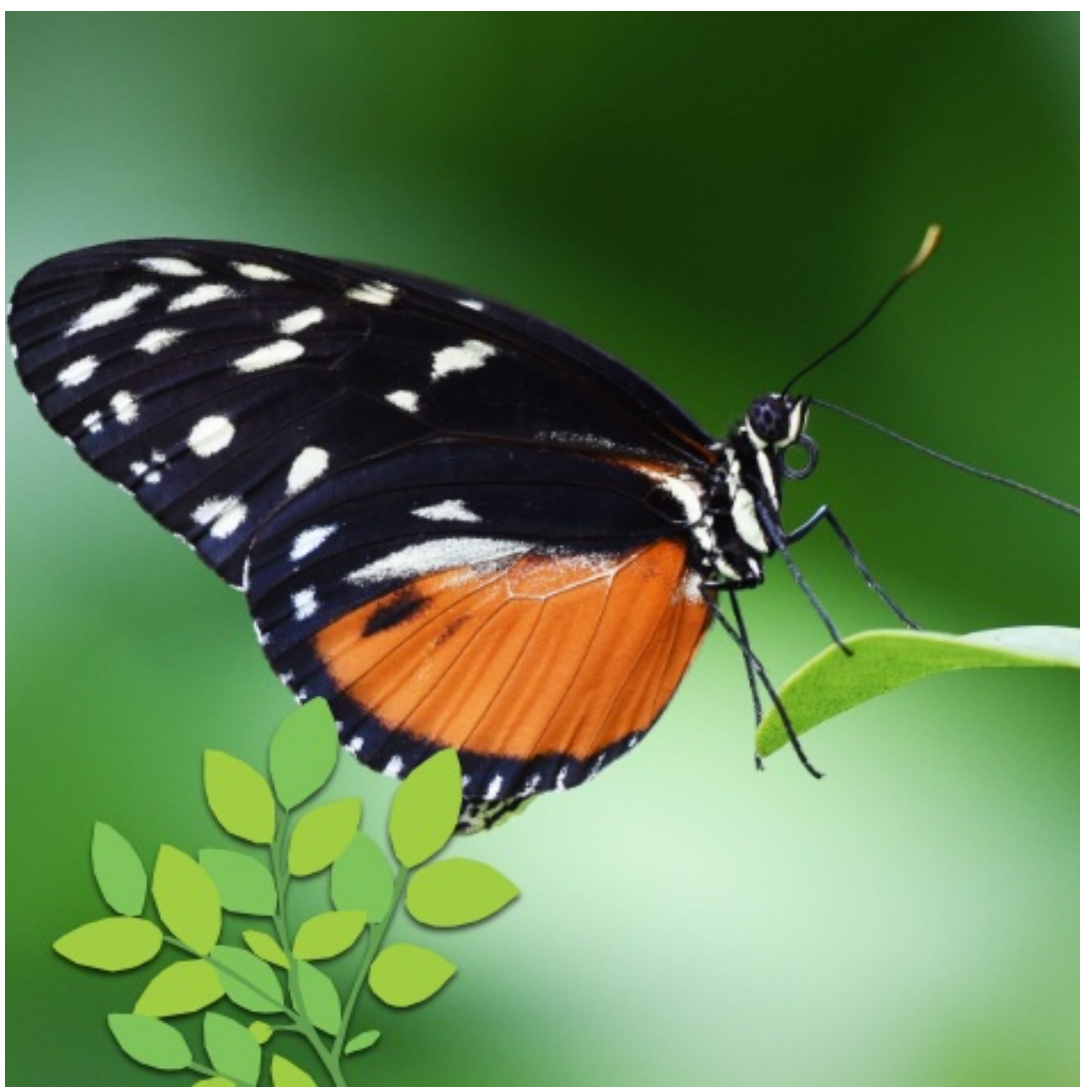
This is an insect. It is a mosquito. Its six legs are on skin. It is sucking blood.



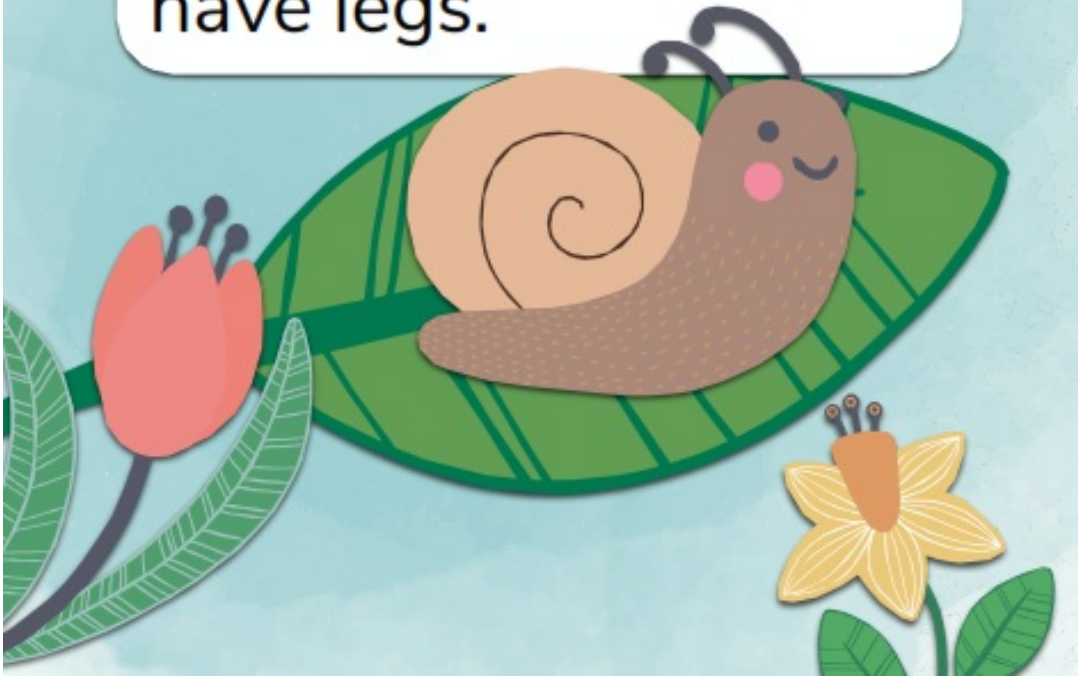


This is an insect. It is a butterfly. Caterpillars do not have six legs, but a butterfly does.

See its six leafy legs?



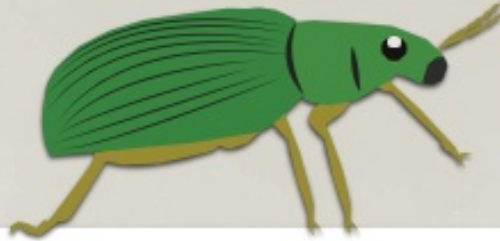


This is an insect. It is a
